California Parole Process

The California Penal Code and accompanying regulations require the Board to set a release date for an inmate unless the inmate currently poses an unreasonable risk of danger to the public. Notwithstanding this presumption in favor of parole, the Board currently denies parole to more than 80% of parole-eligible life inmates.

California Parole Laws, Process & System

The history of California parole law. For the most part, California has a mandatory parole system. This means that unless public safety presents an overriding concern, inmates who are eligible for parole must be paroled once they serve their sentence. Eligible parolees are supposed to be paroled unless they present an overriding public safety risk.
