## Parachute Jump

The Parachute Jump is a defunct amusement ride on the Riegelmann Boardwalk near West 18th Street in Coney Island, Brooklyn, New York City. Its open-frame steel structure measures 250 feet tall and weighs 170 tons. The ride consisted of twelve cantilevered steel arms radiating from the top of the tower, each of which supported a parachute attached to a lift rope and a set of surrounding guide cables. Riders were belted into a two-person canvas seat and dropped from the top, though the parachute a
