Titles (Publication Manual, pp. 185-187) Capitalization: For all sources other than periodicals (that is, newspapers, magazines, and scholarly journals), capitalize the first word of the title and subtitle and proper nouns only. Do not capitalize the rest (see example below). All major words in periodical titles should be

capitalized (for example, Psychology Today, Journal of Health Care for ...
